The public is invited to a special screening of *Bailadores de Bronce – A Cultural Treasure*, a new documentary produced by local filmmakers Mario Zavaleta and Martha Sánchez.

The film chronicles the folkloric dance ensemble as it shares the richness of Mexican culture through dance. Established in 1972 at the University of Washington, the troupe is renowned for the talent, high energy, and enthusiasm the dancers bring to each performance.

Among the producers' previous credits is the documentary *Qwest for a Home – Latino Artists in Seattle*. Their work can also be seen on VMe, the KCTS 9 Spanish-language sister station.

The screening is free of charge.

Additional screenings will take place on December 9, from Noon-1 pm at Hazen High School in Renton, and December 17, from 4:30-6 pm at Sammamish High School in Bellevue.
