Learn about South Seattle Community College's **Transportation, Logistics, and Supply Chain Management** program. The short-term, 19-credit program is designed for working adults who want to gain practical and relevant skills to enter the industry, and professionals seeking to enhance their knowledge. The program covers all aspects of the industry, including airport and seaport operations, supply chain management, domestic and international freight operations, and transportation and border security.

One course is being offered fall quarter (September 27 – December 16):

LOG 235 Introduction to Transportation and Logistics

This course introduces the structure, organization, and operation of a modern airport and seaport, including current issues and challenges. It also examines the critical interface with private sector providers of agency, terminal, stevedoring, tug, and line handling services; the significant roles of customhouse brokers, freight forwarders, and cargo consolidators; and the extent and effects of government regulatory agencies.
