SOUTH SEATTLE COMMUNITY COLLEGE: President Speaks:

Gary Oertli, a native West Seattleite and Chief Seattle high school grad, brings a wealth of administrative and teaching experience to "South." He gave us a concise, but all-inclusive view of the school and its economical and cultural value to the community. In addition to a student body of 16,000, SSCC has a payroll covering 500 employees and a budget of \$53million. A healthy percentage of them volunteer for valuable community services. South is especially proud of training a broad scope of students to qualify them for family-pay jobs for which no workers are currently available. The demand for well trained employees accounts for much of the phenomenal growth at South. As well as a successful Running Start program, SSCC offers a two-year format, and now has several four-year programs earning baccalaureate degrees. A strong percentage of the students are enrolled in studies

transferrable to public and private universities. SSCC is now focusing on the West Seattle Junction area in an effort to connect with the community.
