Georgetown Campus opens new training facility

College expands technology and business development training

A new building for expanded teaching and training programs will be dedicated September 26 at the Georgetown Campus of South Seattle Community College. A 3:15 p.m. ribbon-cutting ceremony will mark the opening of a 9,800 square-foot addition to the existing Gene J. Colin Education Hall.

The LEED-certified facility was designed and built using energy-efficient, sustainable, and water saving strategies. Funding for the \$5.2 million structure came from the Washington State Legislature, the U.S. Economic Development Administration and the Norcliffe Foundation. The new space will be a technology training portal for green, sustainable jobs, and a center for business development and entrepreneurial training.

The building will be open for tours from 3 – 5 p.m., and light refreshments will be served following the brief ribbon-cutting program.
