<b>Intermediate Algebra (IA) Requirement</b>	<b>Courses satisfying the Quantitative Reasoning Requirement</b>
<p>Per transfer agreements with four-year Washington State colleges and universities, proof of proficiency in intermediate algebra is a prerequisite requirement to the AA Degree.
